Youth Service Community Connexions provision per unit-

- 2 Drop in sessions [13-19]
- 1 Project session [13-19]
- 1 Free Association session [13-19]
- 1 Junior session [11-13] run by senior members
- 1 Outreach session
- 1 session or equivalent 1 to 1 work
- Brokerage between young people and services
- 1 school based session

Connexion Service Delivery, Schools

- School based Personal Advisors
- Working a case load of young people
- Offering 1 to 1 support
- Individual learning programmes
- Brokerage between young people and services
- Support groups for young people
- U project summer programme for yr. 11 leavers

This model sits within the Youth Service city-wide priorities: **Detached work, Diversionary Programmes, Health, and Accredited Learning**. The Service also has a number of workers at different levels in the organisation who hold responsibilities for specific areas, for example Youth Arts. These in turn sit within and are supported by the voluntary sector delivery in these areas and in particular around advice and information. The delivery of youth work programmes will be underpinned by the following examples of training programmes: Duke of Edinburgh Award, Y. A. A., Asdan, CSL, Youth and Play. All of the work of the Youth Service holds the core values of **participation, equality of opportunity, social and personal education and voluntary engagement of young people**. The model supports the Connexions Service and strategy.

The introduction of the model into practice will be over a phased period of time, starting from **March to Sept 03** for the first stage which is making adjustment to practice, identifying training, sourcing additional resources, consultation. The implementation phase will be **October to March 04**.¹
