GREEN GROUP AMENDMENT

- 2.2 Agree to a change to the Published Admission Number (PAN) for West Hove Infant School (Connaught Road site) from 90 pupils to 60 pupils.
- 2.3 Agree to a change to the PAN for Hove Junior School (Holland Road site) from 128 pupils to 90 pupils.
- 2.4 Agree to a change of PAN for Mile Oak Primary School from 90 pupils to 60 pupils.
- 2.5 Agree to a change of PAN for Hangleton Primary School from 90 pupils to 60 pupils.
- 2.6 Agree to make no change to the "relevant area".
