

On Monday 16th December 2019, I was on duty in plain clothes, engaged on a test purchase operation for		
the sale of alcohol to minors under the age of 18 years, which is an offence under The Licensing Act 2003.		
About 18:08 hours, I entered Nisa Today, 47 The Highway and at 18:11 hours, a police cadet, who I know to		
be 16 years of age entered. I watched the cadet locate the alcohol section and pick up a bottle of beer		
(which I now know to be Amstel Bier (4.1% ABV)), which is an alcoholic beverage and take it to the counter.		
At this time I moved in behind them in the queue to listen to any conversation and to gather any evidence as		
well as maintaining the safety of the minor.		
The staff member then took the bottle and attempted to scan it through the till. The alcoholic item the		
cadet had selected had been reduced and had a yellow reduction sticker on it. Therefore the sales assistant		
had to type in the product code manually to find the price. The bottle of beer was rung into the till and the		
sales assistant made no attempt to question the cadet's age. I witnessed money leave the hand of the		
cadet, who is under the age of 18 and then the cadet received change and left the store with the alcohol at		
18:13 hours. I purchased my non alcohol items from the same sales assistant before identifying myself as a		
Police Licensing Officer and asking her to step aside. I informed that she had just been the subject of a		
Police Test Purchase operation and that had sold alcohol to a person under the age of 18 years.		
The staff member (A) stated that had not sold alcohol because if it was alcohol then a prompt		
would have flashed up on the till. There was another older (B) behind the counter who had back		
to customers and was putting cigarettes away while the transaction was taking place. turned around and		
started to interact with me and the shop assistant who had made the sale. Shop assistant B reiterated that it		
would not have been alcohol as there were till prompts. I asked them to wait until my uniform colleagues		
arrivad		

#### Continuation of statement of

Uniformed officers entered the store at 18:20 and myself and PC Hancox DH163 left the store to collect the bottle of beer that was purchased and confirm that it was indeed an alcoholic beverage. We returned to the store at 18:21 with the bottle of Amstel Bier (4.1% ABV) and I identified the seller as sales assistant A. In the presence and hearing of both shop assistants A and B, I explained the circumstances and showed them both the label of the bottle with 4.1% ABV printed. The DPS, who I now know as a revived shortly after and it was confirmed to also what had occurred.

I then left the premises, leaving PC Hancox DH163, PC Swan DS780, Hannah Staplehurst (Police Licensing Officer) and (Brighton & Hove City Council Trading Standards Officer) to deal with the matter.

At that location I was informed by a plain clothed officer that they had observed a staff member sell alcohol to a person under the age of 18. I spoke to the person identified as making the sale by the officer, and gave and said name as At 1811 hrs I issued with a £90 fixed penalty notice (FPN) for selling alcohol to a person under 18 contrary to Section 146(1) and (7) of the Licensing Act 2003, whilst other officers from police and council licensing conducted a licensing check of the store. I make this statement using the FPN as my original notes.
