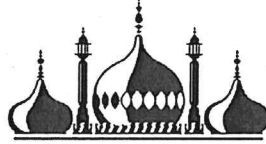

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Annex I - Mandatory conditions

S 19; mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises,
or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 —
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P=D+(D \times V)$$



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where—

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.



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Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule:

For the Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

1. Digital CCTV and appropriate recording equipment to be installed, operated and maintained throughout the premises internally and externally to a standard specification following consultation with Sussex Police. CCTV footage will be stored for a minimum of 28 days, and the management will give full and immediate co-operation and technical assistance to the Police in the event that CCTV footage is requested for the prevention and detection of suspected or alleged crime.
2. The applicant and their staff are able to communicate with customers, the public, and representatives of statutory agencies to a level that satisfies Police and Trading Standards that they are able to meet the four licensing objectives.

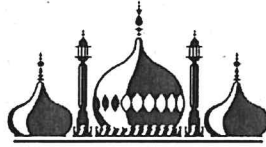
For Public Safety: None.

For the Prevention of Public Nuisance:

3. Suitable signs will be fixed in positions easily visible to customers asking them to leave the premises quietly and have consideration for neighbouring residential properties.

For the Protection of Children from Harm:

4. The premises will adopt a policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol, who appears to be under 21 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The only ID that will be accepted are passports, driving licence with a photograph, or Portman Group proof of age cards bearing the "PASS" mark hologram. The list of approved forms of ID may be amended or revised with the prior written agreement of Sussex Police and the Licensing Authority without the need to amend the actual licence.
5. All staff who serve in the shop will receive full advance training in relation to the sale of alcohol, and especially the photographic ID and challenge 21 policy.
6. The premises will maintain a refusals book to record all incidences of alcohol and other age related products being refused to customers.
7. After 7pm young children (under 16) will be allowed on the premises only if accompanied by an adult.

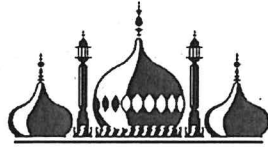


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8. The premises licence holder to employ an external agency to conduct training for all new staff and refresher training on a quarterly basis with training records sent by email to Local Authority's Trading Standards and Local Authority's Licensing Team.
9. The premises licence holder to employ an external agency to conduct test purchases at the premises on a quarterly basis with results of test purchases to be sent to Local Authority's Trading Standards and Local Authority's Licensing team upon completion.

Annex 3 - Conditions Attached after a hearing of a Licensing Panel 19.10.07

1. Between the hours of 19.00 and 23.00 Monday to Sunday, a minimum of 2 members of staff shall be on duty at the premises.
