
Citywide Assessment - Good

National PIs


- Statutory duty to improve early years outcomes for all and to narrow the gap for the most disadvantaged

% achieving a good Foundation Stage result 2008




% of children aged 0-4 living in households dependent

- Childcare for child protection children

Enjoy and Achieve - good

- Children's Centre nurseries good or better including Jumpstart
- Speech and language
- Bookstart

Priorities

- Narrow the gap – all early years services
- Home learning environment
- Childminding and playbus

Positive Contribution - satisfactory

- Individual support for targeted children
- Increasing parental involvement
- Increasing volunteering

Priorities

- Improve consultation with parents and children
- Increase parental involvement
- Use information from other services

Economic Well Being - satisfactory

- Good links with Family Information Service
- Basic service from Jobcentre Plus
- Links with training initiatives
- Priorities
 - Improved support for parents to train or return to work
 - Focus on anti-poverty work

Excluded Groups - satisfactory

- Enhanced service for additional needs
- Improved services for those with English as an additional language, children with disabilities, fathers
