1. SUMMARY AND POLICY CONTEXT:

3. PETITIONS

3. (i) Parking on Saxon Road, Hove– Mr Stuart

To receive the following petition referred from the meeting of Full Council and signed by 42 people:

“We, the undersigned call on Brighton & Hove City Council to move Saxon Road, Hove into parking area L”

3. (ii) Speeding on Falmer Road–Lloyd Russell-Moyle

To receive the following petition referred from the meeting of Full Council and signed by 119 people:

“We the undersigned petition Brighton & Hove Council to take action to address the persistent and dangerous speeding along the stretch of Falmer Road between Longhill School and Wilkinson Close”

3. (iii) Improve Brighton & Hove’s recycling scheme–Tia Meneghetti

To receive the following petition for debate referred from the meeting of Full Council and signed by 2652 people:

“We demand for the Brighton and Hove council to implement weekly kerbside recycling collection and start recycling a wider variety of plastic and food waste.

We require immediate action from Brighton and Hove Council to improve public recycling services. Currently, the local council does not recycle any food packaging plastics or other plastic waste aside from plastic bottles, and even this is on a fortnightly basis. This is unacceptable: comparable local council areas recycle a far wider range of plastics with similar council budgets”.
