**Performance of Dance** – Indoors. Performance of dance is a possibility if arranged in conjunction with other entertainment in the first and upper floors. If so it would be for short periods, it is not a feature of the running of the premises.

**Dancing** – Indoors. Dancing is always possible when music plays but is not a major feature of this premises. There are small dance areas on the first floor rear and upper floors of the premises.

**Making music** – Indoors. An in house amplification system with usual music reproduction facilities is installed on each floor and under strict control of management with sound levels set to ensure no noise problems to nearby properties.

Performance of Live Music – Indoors. Live music is played on average about three times a

week with maybe one or two musicians in the upper rear area only and then only for short periods.

**Performance of Recorded Music** – Indoors. Recorded music is only played through the inhouse systems under strict control and governed by previously agreed levels in conjunction with EHO.

**Entertainment of a similar description** – Indoors. These activities if taking place at all would be of a limited nature and would still use the in house amplification systems ensuring noise levels were controlled. Recorded music could be supplemented by a DJ or Karaoke or Cabaret including the performance of dance, it is not however a feature of the way this premise operates and would

normally be restricted to the first and upper rear floors.

**Late Night Refreshment** – Indoors. Light refreshments including hot drinks such as tea and coffee are available at all times.

Every Day: 23:00 - 05:00

### The opening hours of the premises

### **Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

S 19; mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

S 21; mandatory condition: door supervision

 where a premises licence includes a condition relating to security activity, the licence must include a condition that each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (there are exemptions re theatre and films and clubs)

### On Licence

### 1. Permitted Hours

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

Supply or sale of alcohol also permitted from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day.

### Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

### For Prevention Of Crime and Disorder

- CCTV to be operated externally and internally to the satisfaction of the Chief Officer of Police
- 2. Door supervisors to be provided as necessary.

### For Public Safety

1. The number of persons permitted on the licensed premises at any one time shall not exceed: - 55 First floor front, 50 first floor rear, 90 second floor.

#### For Prevention Of Public Nuisance

- 1. Noise limiter set to a level agreed by Director of Environment.
- 2. Adequate ventilation or air conditioning will be installed suitably attenuated to ensure noise levels outside neighbouring residential windows are no higher than Leq 45 dB(A).
- 3. Emergency exit doors to rear of premises, except for second floor rear door to be fitted with alarm or other such device as agreed by Director of Environment to prevent use other than in an emergency.
- 4. Access and exit from the premises shall be only from the front door on Western Road except in an emergency.

### For the protection of children from harm

- 1. Persons under 18 must be accompanied by an adult
- 2. No persons under 18 are permitted on the premises between midnight and 5 am
- 3. Licensees and staff shall operate a 'Think 21' policy in that any person attempting to purchase alcohol who appears under the age of 21 will be asked to produce photographic identification. The acceptable forms of photographic identification will be a passport, photocard driving licence, pass scheme photographic ID or other photographic ID approved by the authorities.
