3. PETITIONS

3. (i) Double Yellow Lines Roedean Crescent West – Craig Jones

To receive the following petition signed by 37 people at the time of publication:

"We the undersigned petition Brighton & Hove Council to increase the length of double yellow lines at the west entrance to Roedean Crescent"

3. (ii) Roedean Controlled Parking Zone– Craig Jones

To receive the following petition signed by 163 people at the time of publication:

“We the undersigned petition Brighton & Hove Council to improve road safety by creating a ‘Light Touch’ Controlled Parking Zone in the residential area of Roedean including the streets and roads east of Brighton Fire Station and west of Roedean School”

3. (iii) Punitive Parking Charges and Restrictions– Steve Hilton

To receive the following petition signed by 13 people at the time of publication:

“We the undersigned petition Brighton & Hove Council to Free parking on Sundays for residents and visitors. Free parking on Xmas day. 30 -60 minutes free parking to visit local shops. Cost to run the residents permit scheme to be non profit making. Scrapping of the CO2 emission bands. End parking restriction at 6pm. No increases in charges for a minimum of 5+ years to bring the costs down to more reasonable levels taking into account inflation. All parking machines to accept cash as well as the other payment methods. No more zones to have parking restrictions unless a large majority of residents vote and agree”

3. (iv) Clean Up Kemptown– Arabella Kump

To receive the following petition signed by 469 people at the time of publication:

“We the undersigned petition Brighton & Hove Council to focus on the enormous amount of street litter, human faeces on stairs and beach, overflowing bins, unsatisfactory street cleaning, dog fouling and graffiti throughout Kemp Town. We also need to improve recycling access and sorting to all households”.
