(1) Parking Saves the Arches – Russell Smith

To receive the following petition signed by 55 people at the time of publication:

"We the undersigned petition Brighton & Hove Council to lobby government for a one-off special status to use parking revenue generated on Madeira Drive to invest in the Arches restoration."
