## Acting Chief Finance Officer's comments:

Environmental Impact Assessments (EIA) are expensive reviews likely to cost between £50,000 to £100,000 depending of what is specified. While the Environment, Transport & Sustainability Committee can therefore consider the merits of calling for an EIA, if minded to support an EIA the committee will need to seek Policy & Resources Committee approval to commit resources, including identification of how the EIA is to be funded.
