(1) Women's Health - Ms Jean Calder:

"There are widespread concerns about women's health, nationally and locally. These include low take-up of smear tests, dangerous maternity provision, cuts to female-only services and a failure to address female illnesses such as endometriosis. The Government's recent consultation on women's health released a tsunami of dissatisfaction from many thousands of women who reported widespread sexism within health services and arrogant indifference to women's needs. In response, the Women's Health Ambassador, Professor Lesley Regan has called for Women's Health Hubs across the country. Will you support this initiative, ensuring that if government money becomes available, we bid for it?"
