

Proposed Change of Age Range and Enlargement of Premises of St Peter's Community Infant School

Notice is given in accordance with section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Brighton & Hove City Council intends to make a prescribed alteration to St Peter's Community Infant School, St Peter's Rd, Portslade, Brighton, BN41 1LS, from 2nd September 2013.

- 1) changing the age range of the school by a year or more and,
- 2) enlarging the premises of the school

It is proposed that St Peter's Community Infant School is made in to a one form entry all through primary school from September 2013. The new school will have an intake of 30 pupils at 4+. Flexibility would be provided for Key Stage 2 to take additional children to a maximum of 32 children per class.

It is not intended to implement this proposal in stages.

The current capacity of the school is 90 and the proposed capacity will be 210. The current admission number for the school is 30 and the proposed admission number will be 30.

As part of the Council's future development of Schools within the city it is proposed to create an all through primary school by extending the age range of St Peter's Community Infant School from 4+ to 7 as it is at present to 4+ to 11 from September 2013. St Peter's Community Infant School is currently a one form entry infant school admitting 30 pupils per year. This proposal is part of a wider re-organisation of school places within Portslade which, if successful, will result in an additional 2 forms of entry overall for primary phase education for this part of the city.
