Why are we consulting you?

This document is published by Brighton and Hove City Council and is intended as a basis for consultation with governors, staff, pupils, parents and other interested groups about a proposal to extend the age range of St Peter's Community Infant school to make it a one form entry all-through Primary School.

Some background facts

The proposal is to extend the age range and expand the infant school so that it becomes a one form entry Primary School with a yearly intake of 30.

At present St Peter's Infant School is a one form entry infant school which admits pupils into school year R, then at age seven children transfer to junior schools, generally in the locality. This proposal has arisen as a result of an earlier change in age range of Benfield School which has resulted in there being more infant school places in Portslade than there are junior places. The proposal now being put forward for St Peter's Community Infant School will assist in addressing this deficit when linked with similar proposals to extend the age ranges of St. Nicolas C of E Junior School and Portslade Infant School making them in to all through primary schools too.

This proposal will result in the need to provide an extension at the school to accommodate the increased number of pupils.

The next stage

All of the views put forward during the consultation stage will be reported to the Cabinet Member. This will allow an informed decision to be made regarding progression to the next stage in the process. The next stage is the issuing of a Statutory Notice detailing the proposal. The notice will be in force for a period of six weeks during which time objections to and comments on the proposal may be made by any person or group. Details of how to make an objection or comment will be incorporated within the Statutory Notice.
