<u>Applicant's submission in respect of the Brighton + Hove City Council</u> Cumulative Impact Policy

The Applicant submits that the proposed conditions/Operating Schedule as set out below will ensure that the granting of a Premises licence in respect of these premises – which it will be noted were licensed until 02/08 – does not add to the perceived Cumulative Impact of Licensed premises in particular in the St James Street Area

It is noted:

- 1. These are small and intimate premises
- 2. they have a very limited floor area which will largely be taken up by seating with a limit on numbers of it is anticipated between 40 and 50 to include staff
- 3. There will be no loud music be it live or recorded and no dancing
- 4. Appropriate door staff will be employed
- 5. Entry to the premises in the last 60 minutes of trading will be prohibited so as to rather encourage a gradual run down of trade and of customers leaving
- 6. The premise do not lend themselves to operate as a traditional CafeBar but the operation will be very similar with some food available.

Proposed conditions/Operating Schedule

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. Digital CCTV to be installed maintained and operated to the Sussex Police specification with recordings maintained for not less than 28 days such recordings to be made available to the Police immediately upon request
- 2. The Premises will employ not less than one SIA registered door supervisor from 2200 on any day when the premises are open at that time until 15 minutes after the premises shall be closed and cleared and at all times (a) contract for a Mobile Support service with an SIA registered organisation and (b) join the Business Crime Reduction Partnership and participate in any "Exclusion Scheme"
- 3. Crime Prevention posters to be displayed in the premises when requested by the Police
- 4 not less than 60% of the service area shall be given over to the use of patrons seated at tables and chairs (provided that the service area may be cleared for the purpose of stand-up functions on not more than 12 occasions per year subject on each occasion to not less than 7 days written notice given to the Police)
- 5. Sales by waiter/waitress service shall be available at all times

Public Safety

- 1. The numbers of persons to include staff in the premises as a whole and/or in any particular part thereof shall not exceed the lesser of either 50 or such numbers as shall be agreed with the Fire Officer from time to time
- 2. All sales shall be in toughened glass vessels

Prevention of Public Nuisance

1. The Licensee shall ensure that (1) excessive noise does not come from the premises such as to cause persons in the neighbourhood to be unreasonably

disturbed and (2) prominent clear and legible notices are displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

- 2. The playing of any recorded music shall be maintained at background levels only
- 3. No patrons shall be admitted to the premises within 60 minutes of the anticipated closing time on any night the premises shall be open after 2300 hrs

Protection of Children

- 1. No person under 18 shall be allowed on the Premises after 2200 on any day nor unless accompanyied by an adult
- 2. As to alcohol sales the Premises will adopt a policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 21 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The only Id that will be accepted are passports, Driving Licenses with a photograph or Portman Group proof of age cards bearing the "Pass" mark hologram. The List of approved forms of ID may be amended or revised with the prior written agreement of Sussex Police and the Licensing Authority without the need to amend the actual Licence
